Provided Equipment

1 This training assumes that the participants provide their own equipment and ammo rounds.

Upon request and against an additional charge, NCTS will provide each participant with the following equipment for the training sessions:

Roles and Responsibilities

Responsibilities of the participants

Unless the participant did no request the equipment to be provided by NCTS, they are required to:

- provide their own type AR-15 rifle with sling; the rifle should be equipped with Aimpoint or Eotech optoelectronics
- provide at least 1200 rounds of 5.56 × 45mm ammunition
- provide eye and ear protection

Responsibilities of NCTS

- Preparation and conducting of training sessions.
- Securing weapons and ammunition during the sessions.
- Medical assistance during the sessions.

Providing catering during the training sessions. If group training is conducted (i.e., not individual sessions), one instructor will be required for every six participants.



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
